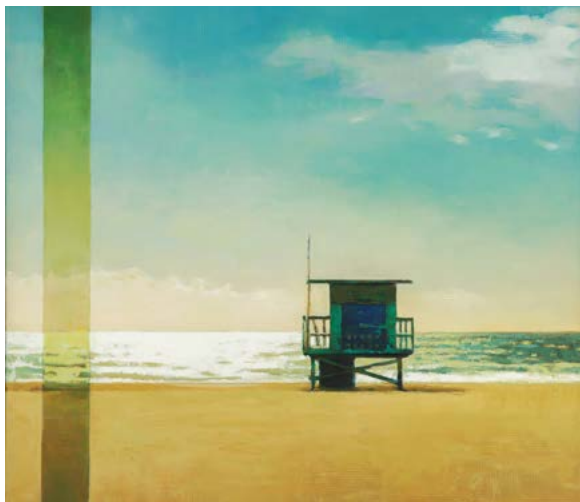

Bogdan Kravchenko

October 23 –
December 5, 2026

Bogdan Kravchenko explores landscapes and still lifes through abstract close-ups that balance quiet natural forms with architectural structure. Working intuitively with color, light, and texture, he moves beyond literal representation to create minimalist compositions shaped by tension and stillness. His work reflects a search for serenity, inviting viewers into an inner landscape removed from the noise of everyday life.

Elena Mamenko

December 11, 2026 –
January 23, 2027

Elena Mamenko's photography and visual art draw from nature, memory, and a life shaped by movement across Russia, Taiwan, and the United States. Through organic forms, natural rhythms, and abstract graphic elements, she creates atmospheric images that invite close observation. Her work considers the relationship between place and feeling, transforming encounters with the natural world into quiet spaces for reflection and reconnection.

Ilene Gruber Adams

January 29 –
March 13, 2027

Ilene Gruber Adams uses bold color, layered texture, and intuitive form to explore the emotional possibilities of abstraction. Drawing from painting, photography, and mixed media, she transforms familiar imagery through exaggerated hues, light, and tactile surfaces. Her works move between reality and imagination, using color as a visual language to reveal beauty, memory, and unexpected connections within the world around us.

The Gayle and Paul Gross Gallery provides space for focused exhibitions by individual artists, offering visitors an opportunity to spend time with a distinct body of work and artistic point of view. Artists are selected through a highly competitive process by a panel of art professionals. In addition to a professional solo exhibit, the artists also receive a stipend to help cover the cost of packing and transportation.

Heather Couch

March 19 –
April 30, 2027

Heather Couch works in ceramic sculpture and mixed-media installation, creating gestural and intentionally unstable structures that explore uncertainty through form and texture. Relating the rhythms and irregularities of nature to social systems and everyday life, she embraces chance, tension, and contrasting perspectives. Her compositions balance strength and fragility, awkwardness and beauty, inviting discovery, reflection, and comfort with open-ended questions.

Keren Kroul

May 7 –
June 19, 2027

Keren Kroul creates large-scale watercolors that explore the shifting landscape of memory. Drawing from inherited family stories, maps, flora, and neural networks, she fragments and layers imagery into dense compositions where time and place converge. The fluidity of watercolor mirrors memory itself, as images surface, dissolve, and reappear across gridded sheets of paper separated by deliberate moments of pause.

Sandy Lerman

June 25 –
August 6, 2027

Sandy Lerman transforms everyday objects into layered still lifes that invite a closer look at the overlooked and familiar. Working in acrylic on textured, previously used canvases, she explores changing light, shadow, reflection and pattern through compositions defined by unexpected vantage points and unusual cropping. Drawing from objects encountered throughout her life, Lerman creates surprising relationships between the humble, elegant, flashy and ordinary.

Molded & Mannered

Artists from the Ceramic League of the Palm Beaches explore the creative possibilities of clay through a range of ceramic practices. From functional objects to sculptural works, the exhibition highlights the versatility of the medium and the individual approaches artists bring to shaping, firing and transforming it.



Karate Bagels Dance

December 18, 2026 – February 20, 2027

Inspired by a Virginia strip mall where three neighboring storefronts—karate, bagels and dance—shared the same lettering, their names read together as a quirky, accidental phrase that became a nickname for the plaza itself. Artists similarly explore language as both meaning and image, shaped by typography, placement and context.

Palm Beach County-based professional artists explore contemporary approaches to portraiture and the many ways identity, presence and the human form can be interpreted. Moving beyond physical resemblance alone, the works consider how a likeness can reveal personality, emotion, experience and the ways we see ourselves and one another.

Kick off the season with a sun-soaked 1965 favorite. *Beach Blanket Bingo* brings surf, sand, music, and classic beach-movie fun to the former Lake Theatre in a screening that playfully complements the Council's *Sun, Sand, & Surf* exhibition.

FOOD ON FILM: *BIG NIGHT* February 5, 2027

Food, family, ambition, and artistry collide in *Big Night*, the acclaimed 1996 film starring Stanley Tucci and Tony Shalhoub. Presented in connection with *Foodways*, the screening explores the rituals and relationships that make a shared meal about much more than what's on the plate.

The season continues with a special film program celebrating Black cinema and storytelling from the 1940s with Associate Professor of Cinematic Arts at University of Miami, Dr. Terri Francis.

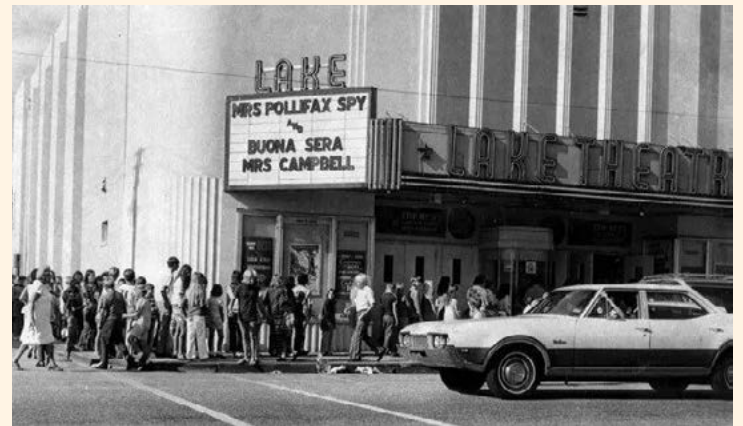

The Lake Theatre Revival Series returns for a second season, bringing classic and culturally significant films back to the building that opened as the Lake Theatre in 1940.

Presented on select evenings throughout the year, screenings pair memorable films with community partnerships and conversations that connect cinema to the people, places, and programs of Palm Beach County.

The Cultural Council's headquarters is the former Lake Theatre, a Streamline Moderne movie house that welcomed its first audiences in 1940. Today's film programs reconnect the building with its cinematic past while creating new opportunities for conversation, discovery, and community.
